The principles of Right Way Training have been gathered from a number of sources, the most dominant source being the teachings of John McGee, known as "Gentle Teaching". In some respects, Right Way Training differs subtly from Gentle Teaching.

The word RIGHT is an acronym in which each letter provides the basis for a foundational truth.

R stands for Respect
I stands for Influence
G stands for Genuine
H stands for Humane, and
T stands for Teamwork and Togetherness.

This seminar will review an intro of Right Way Basics and then expand the general principles of Right Way Training into Right Way Leadership and Right On Time Crisis Prevention. The program attempts to show supervisors and managers that a consistent model of "Right Way" behavior is needed if we are to expect our caregivers to provide Right Way Care. This program also explores the responsibilities of managers to apply coaching principles in their leadership role. Leadership is more than expectations and having a good philosophy for your staff. It needs to embrace a top down and bottom up modeling and mutual respect.

Right on Time Crisis Prevention Training will equip the learner with skills consistent with de-escalating crisis situations in all aspects of life. The expectations we face in addressing challenging behaviors is ever increasing. As we all face financial, recruitment and competency challenges we need to have a focus that can be understood from top to bottom. This includes the ability to write a behavior support plan that is REAL and one that staff can understand and follow. This component of the training will provide you with tools you can use immediately in your program. The principles and documents used are understand-able, usable and available. You will be able to ask questions and shape the resources to meet the behavioral demands of your program.
