# What is Public Policy?

Public policy is how a government meets the needs of its people

- Actions
- Funding priorities
- Laws
- Regulations



### Who Creates Public Policy?

Elected officials create public policy but Advocates can help!



#### How a Bill Becomes a Law





# Specifically:

- ✓\*Identify Ideas??
- ✓ Write the Bill (LRB).
- ✓\*Find Sponsor(s).
- ✓ File the Bill. (House and/or Senate)
- ✓ Bill is introduced.
- ✓\*Submit Witness Slip. Give Testimony. Observe.

- ✓ Vote on Bill.
- ✓ Bill moves to Other Chamber.
- ✓\*Submit Witness Slip. Give Testimony. Observe.
- ✓ Other Chamber Votes on Bill.
- ✓ Bill Sent to Governor.
- ✓Governor



# **Budget Is Slightly Different**

- In **September** of the year preceding the start of the new fiscal year, the <u>governor</u> sends budget instructions to state agencies.
- In **October** and **November**, agencies submit their budget requests to the governor.
- Budget hearings with the public are held from **February** through **May**.
- On the third Wednesday in **February**, the governor submits his or her proposed budget to the <u>Illinois General Assembly</u>.
- The General Assembly passes a budget in May.



### Witness Slips – How to Find Them

- Go to <u>www.ilga.gov</u> and searching for the Senate or House bill.
- Once you have determined which committee will consider the legislation, go back to the homepage of <u>www.ilga.gov</u> and click "GA Dashboard" under "Reports and Inquiry" in the middle column. Or <u>http://my.ilga.gov/</u>.

# Witness Slips – How to Fill Them Out

- To submit your own witness slip, go to <a href="http://my.ilga.gov/">http://my.ilga.gov/</a> and click "Create Witness Slip" in the right column of the legislation that interests you.
- Enter your information, the names of the groups or firms you represent and your position (support or oppose) on the legislation.
- "What type of testimony you'd like to submit."
  - "Record of Appearance Only"
  - "Oral
  - "Written statement filed" It is your responsibility to get a copy of your written statement to the chairman or chairwoman of that committee.
- Once you have completed the required information, click "Create (Slip)" at the bottom of the page.



#### How to Track a Bill

- The first step is to identify which legislation you are interested in supporting or opposing, then finding out which committee will hear it. You can do that by going to <a href="http://www.ilga.gov">www.ilga.gov</a> and searching for the Senate or House bill.
- Left hand side search the bill number
- Top bar search under House and Senate for committee schedules and if you want to listen to a committee hearing.




Plug in your zipcode and a list of your Federal, State, and Local representatives will come up.

### Prepare to Talk to Legislators:

- 1. Tell them who you are, that you are constituent
- 2. What your issue of concern is and how they might help
- 3. Make the ask ask them to support your issue, work with you or keep talking to you about it





#### Tips to Remember My Voice, My Choice

- 1. Always be polite.
- 2. Say thank you.
- 3. Be prepared and keep your story straight.
- 4. Never make up an answer.
- 5. Expect to have 10-15 minutes only.
- 6. Be patient.
- 7. Ask how you can help them.



# **Top 2020 Public Policy Issues**

- Investment in Community Living
  - Address the staff crisis by getting wages above minimum wage
  - Increase rates for more individualized services and supports in the community
- Employment
  - Subminimum wage
  - Additional investments customized employment, supported employment
  - Transportation
- Education
  - Seclusion and Restraint
  - Transition age youth



- Supported Decision making Guardianship and Advocacy
- PUNS waiting list
- Systems transformation
  - Fiscally responsible spending of dollars
  - Universal assessments and person centered plans for all people with I/DD regardless of where they live
  - Implementation of the HCBS settings rule
- Assistive Technology
- Other regulatory/administrative changes
- Implementation of previous year's bills (criminal justice task force, customized employment pilot, funding diversion homes)
