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HEALTHCARE AND FAMILY SERVICES

Healthcare coverage for adults and children who qualify for Medicaid or Medical Assistance Programs.

Child Support Services to ensure children receive financial support from both parents.



MEDICAID

A hallmark of President Lyndon Johnson's War on Poverty was Medicaid.

Congress adopted President Johnson's proposal through the Social Security Amendments of 1965 which added Title XIX to the Social Security Act.

A federal-state partnership program designed to assist states in providing medical coverage for low-income families and other categorically related individual.



MEDICAID

- Federal statute establishes the fundamental program parameters and within those federal parameters, states determine:
 - who is eligible for enrollment
 - which services are covered, and
 - how services are reimbursed.



OTHER MEDICAL PROGRAMS

- The Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) was signed into law in 1997 and provides health coverage to eligible children, through both Medicaid and separate CHIP programs.
- Beginning in 2014, the Affordable Care Act (ACA) provided states the authority to expand Medicaid eligibility to individuals under 65 in families with incomes below 133 percent of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL).



Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS)

CMS is a federal agency within the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services that administers the Medicare program and works in partnership with state governments to administer Medicaid.



MEDICAID STATE PLAN

- A Medicaid and CHIP state plan is an agreement between a state and the Federal government describing how the state will administer its Medicaid and CHIP programs.
- Changes are made to the State Plan via amendments.

Amendments are sent to CMS for review and approval.
