- Medicaid Waivers are state-run programs that use federal and state funds to pay for health care for people with certain health conditions
- Without health care and service needs would either go without services or would be institutionalized in order to qualify for Medicaid

Medicaid Waivers (continued)

- Medicaid Waivers permit states to use flexibility to design publicly financed health care systems outside of certain federal Medicaid statutory and regulatory requirements
 - Each state has different Waivers with different eligibility requirements
 - or services
- Illinois has nine (9) Home and Community-Based Service (HCBS) waivers.
 - Each waiver is designed for individuals with similar needs and offers a different set of services

Waiver Services

The Division of Developmental Disabilities is the Operating Agency for three (3) Waivers:

- 1. Adult Waiver
 - Waiver for adults with Developmental Disabilities (DD)
 - Home-Based Services (HBS), Community Day Services
 - Community Integrated Living Arrangement (CILA), Community Living Facility (CLF) 16 bed or less



Waiver Services (continued)

The Division of Developmental Disabilities is the Operating Agency for three (3) Waivers:



- Supports Waiver for children and young adults with DD
- Children's HBS
- 3. Children's Residential Waiver
 - Waiver for residential supports for children and young adults with DD
 - Child Group Home



Overview of the People We Serve

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What is a Developmental Disability?

A person is determined to have a developmental disability if the person has <u>Intellectual Disability</u> or a <u>Related Condition</u>.





Overview of the People We Serve

- Intellectual Disability
 - General intellectual functioning with an IQ score of 70 or below on standard assessments
 - Significant limitations in daily functioning (living skills, communication, self-care, independence, etc.)
 - Occurs before the age of 18 years



Overview of the People We Serve (continued)

Related Condition

- Attributable to cerebral palsy or epilepsy, or any condition, other than mental illness, found to be closely related to intellectual disability
- Manifests before age 22 and likely to continue indefinitely
- Results in substantial limitation of functioning in 3 or more major life activities:
 - -- Self-Care, Language, Learning, Mobility, Self-Direction, and Capacity for Independent Living






Independent Service Coordination (ISC) Agency. . . Front Doors to Illinois DD Services

People who want or need DD services must apply at the Independent Service Coordination (ISC) agency that serves the region of the state they live in.

ISC/PAS Agencies





Independent Service Coordination (ISC) (continued)

ISC agencies :

- Maintain the PUNS database
- Conduct Pre-Admission screens (PAS) to determine eligibility for DD services
- Provide Case Management to people who are enrolled in a DD Waiver program










Overview of Illinois DD Services






Illinois DD Service System

- Approximately 350-400 community service providers
- Over 23,300 individuals served in community-based Medicaid services
- Approximately 6,200 individuals are served in Intermediate Care Facilities/Developmental Disabilities (ICFs/DD)
- Approximately 1,800 individuals are served in State Operated Developmental Centers



HOME-BASED SUPPORTS



Services to help children and adults live at home.

- ✓Transportation (for adults)
- ✓ Day and Employment programs (for adults)
- ✓ Behavior Therapy
- ✓ Other Therapies: Physical, Occupational and Speech (for adults)
- ✓Personal support

DAY & Employment SERVICES – (for Adults)

Supported employment
Community Day Service
Adult day care
At home day services




These services enhance skills in major life areas, work-related activities & employment skills. Children receive educational services through the school system.



Assistive Technology, Adaptive Equipment and Modifications to your Home or Vehicle Available only as waiver services.

Examples:

- Communication board
- Ramp to enter/exit your home
- Modifications to bathroom making it accessible
- Lift on van
- *requires pre-approval from the Division







RESIDENTIAL SERVICES -Adult

Community Integrated Living Arrangement (CILA)

- Waiver service
- Intermittent, Family,
- Host Family, or
- 24-Hour

Community Living Facility (CLF)

- 16 bed or less is a waiver service
- 17 or more beds is a non waiver service Intermediate Care Facilities/DD
- Non-Waiver, entitlement

RESIDENTIAL SERVICES -Children

Child Group Home(Waiver)

Child Care Institution(non-waiver)

Service Limits

Adult Home Based monthly budget

- Based on 3 times the Social Security Income (SSI) which is currently \$2,349 per month
- If still in school, based on 2 times SSI which is currently \$1,566
- Children's Support monthly and annual budget
 - Annual budget is based on 2 times SSI so total annual amount is \$18,792
 - Monthly spend allows carryover so an individual can spend up to 4 times SSI in a single month for a total monthly spend of \$3,132

Services with monthly and annual limits

- Day Programs total combined monthly limit of 115 hours and 1,100 hours annually
- Behavior Intervention 66 hours for Children's Residential Waiver and 104 hours for Adult Waiver
- Adaptive Equipment, Home Modifications, and Vehicle Modifications \$15,000 combined for a 5 year period



Your Responsibilities

- Maintain your financial eligibility
 - Medicaid benefits
 - ISC is available to help
- Report occurrences of abuse, neglect or exploitation
 - Department of Children and Family Services call 800-252-2873
 - Adult Protective Services call 866-800-1409 or 888-206-1327 TTY
 - Office of Inspector General 800-368-1463 or 800-447-6404 TTY
- Update your ISC Agency if you have or want any major changes (I.e. address, living arrangement, supports, etc.)
- If you are using HBS Manage your services
 - Ensure HBS supports are used appropriately -Your right to self-direct can be taken away from you
 - Purchase services within your monthly budget
 - Keep your Service Authorizations up to date
 - SDA is available to help
