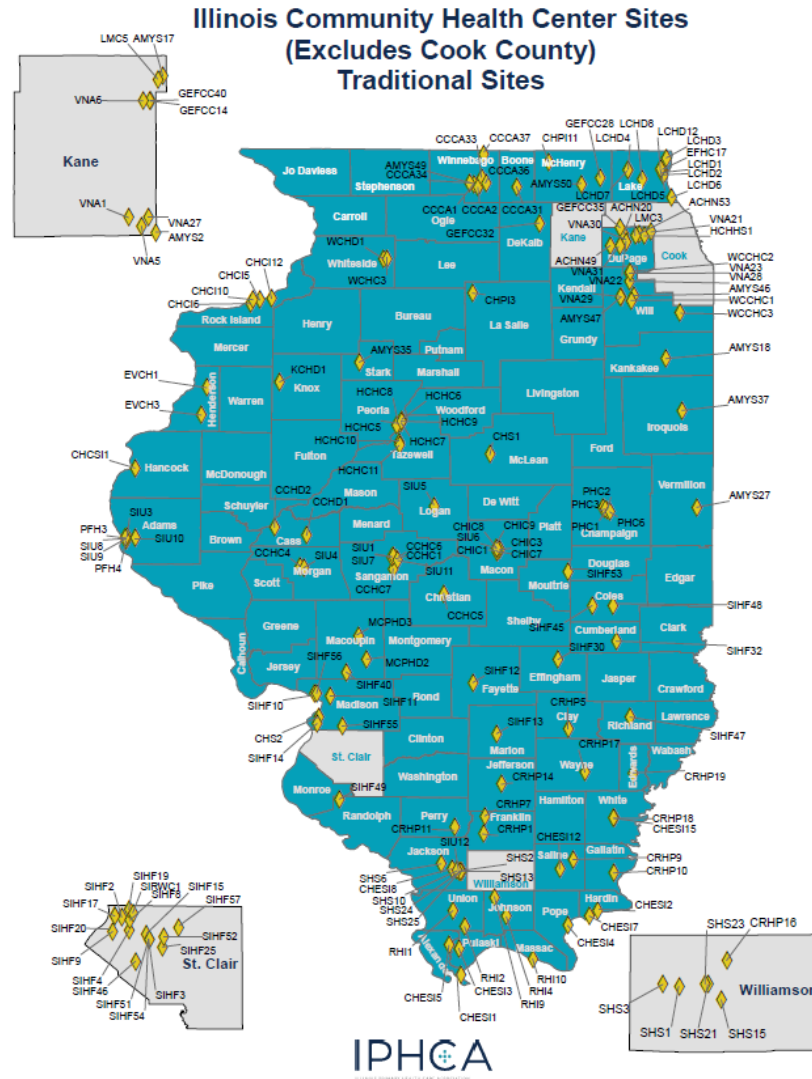

What Do Community Health Centers Do?

- Community Health Centers offer high-quality, comprehensive primary care at low to no cost including:
 - **Preventative and routine medical care** like annual check-ups, physicals, immunizations, coughs & colds, common infections, women's health, pre-natal care, chronic disease management (e.g., diabetes, asthma, depression), and much more!
 - **Behavioral health** care like mental health and substance use treatment
 - **Dental care**
 - **Vision**
 - **Pharmacy** to enable prescription medication access
 - **Specialized Services** vary by location and may include drop-in centers, urgent care, and dental for individuals with special needs.



What Do Community Health Centers Do?

- In addition to providing care, Community Health Centers also help patients get connected to programs and supports needed to live well and stay healthy.
 - Apply for **health coverage** and other public benefits like WIC, SNAP (Link Card)
 - Referrals to **social services**
 - Referrals to **specialists**
 - **Translation**
 - **Transportation**
 - **Case Management**
 - **Care Coordination**
 - **Health Education**
 - **Community Outreach**

What Do Community Health Centers Do?

- Many Community Health Centers are offering COVID testing and vaccination.
 - Walk-up, drive-through, and mobile sites
 - Some first come first serve and others appointment-only. Call ahead to be sure.

- Telehealth is available during the public health emergency.



Who Are Community Health Center Patients?

- Everyone!
- CHCs serve patients across the lifespan, from babies to seniors.
- All individuals served regardless of:
 - Insurance type or coverage, including Medicaid, Medicare, private insurance, and the uninsured
 - Immigration status
 - Income or ability to pay – sliding scale available; assistance applying for health coverage
