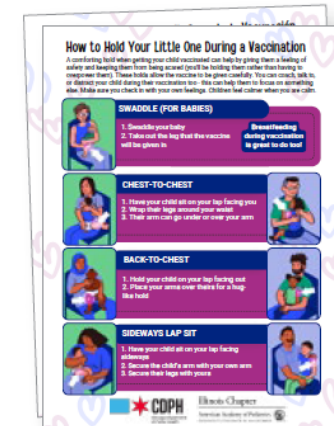
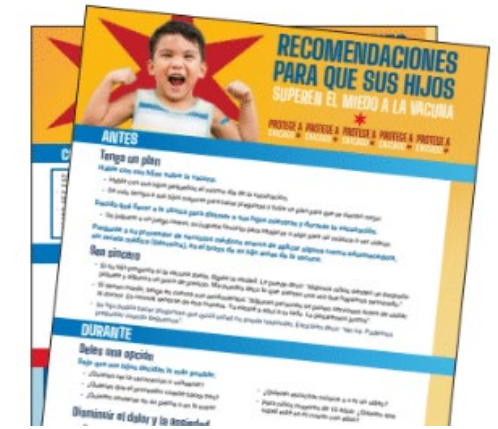
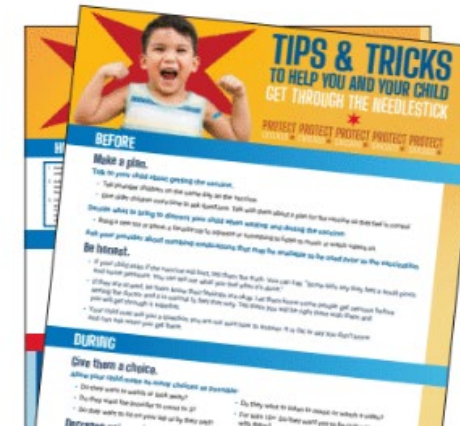
BACK-TO-SCHOOL CAMPAIGN
