

Today, we provide services to more than 500 individuals and their families. Our service consumers range in age from 5 to 95 years and include people with Epilepsy, Cerebral Palsy, Autism, and other substantial chronic disabilities incurred before maturity.

From finding community-based jobs to developing additional pathways to employment by providing volunteer opportunities in the community. we help our consumers find satisfying and lasting work by putting employment first offering personalized supports every step of the way.

Our Community Day Services offers adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities a wide array of weekday activities through community inclusion programs that focus on the development and enhancement of daily living skills by fostering appropriate behavior, greater independence and personal choice.



New Star's residential program helps our consumers find the right balance between their desire for independence and their needs for supervised care. Our community living options include I-CILAs, CILAs, and Privately Owned Group Homes. We also offer Home-Based Support Services to help coordinate the care needed for individuals who wish to remain at home.
