The Autism Program of Illinois (TAP) is a statewide network dedicated to improving the lives of individuals with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) and their families. As a collaboration of 10 organizations and 5 universities that together operate 20 centers across the state, TAP provides resources, services, education, and training that respond to the unique needs of different communities across Illinois.

Our History

In 2003, the General Assembly passed Public Act 93-0395, establishing TAP as a response to the steadily rising number of children diagnosed with autism and the lack of available services.

The most recent Center for Disease Control (CDC) publication indicates that there are now 1 in 44 children living with ASD. Research shows that the need for autism services, research, and training will continue to grow - TAP has and will continue to lead the charge in the state of Illinois.

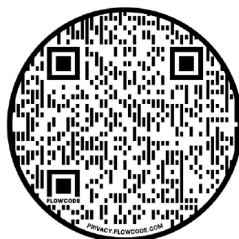
