

\$50 Summit Registration fee is required for <u>all</u> attendees, <u>including personal support</u> <u>workers.</u> Financial assistance for registration fee is available. (Please see Form 3.)

To Attend SUSO in Springfield, IL:

- Submit Registration Form and \$50 payment, or complete the Financial Assistance Request (Form 3).
- <u>Do not</u> reserve a hotel room or book transportation until you receive a confirmation phone call.
- T-Shirts will be given during check-in.
- Groups from one agency have a limit of <u>15 total</u> individuals to attend inperson, including support staff.

To Attend SUSO Virtually:

- Submit Registration Form and \$50 payment, or complete the Financial Assistance Request (Form 3). There is a limit of 25 individuals from one agency to apply for a stipend.
- **T-SHIRT DEADLINE:** In order to mail your t-shirt in time for SUSO, please register by **August 25, 2023.** After this date, we <u>cannot guarantee</u> you will receive your t-shirt by SUSO. T-Shirts will be mailed to the address on your registration.
- Make sure correct email address is listed on your registration form to receive the Zoom link.

Hotel and Travel Information

SUSO will be at the President Abraham Lincoln DoubleTree Hotel. Everyone attending in Springfield and needing a hotel room must make their own reservations and inform the hotel of any special accommodations. **Do not reserve a hotel room or book transportation until you receive a** <u>confirmation phone call.</u>

The single and double hotel rate is \$135.66 including tax per night. \$11.40 including tax for each additional person in the room per night. Wait until you receive registration confirmation to book your room. The Arc of Illinois will share the special rate code and any additional information to book your room. There are limited number of accessible rooms. **If you need an accessible room, please contact Becca Schroeder directly at 815.464.1832 or becca@thearcofil.org.**

If you need driving directions to the President Abraham Lincoln DoubleTree please go to Google Maps or you can call 815.464.1832 for assistance.

There is an Amtrak Train Station 5 blocks from the DoubleTree. Take Washington 4 blocks, then right on 7th Street for 1 block. To make a train reservation, call Amtrak at 1.800.872.7245.

If you need accessible transportation from the Amtrak Station to the DoubleTree, call ACCESS SPRINGFIELD at 217.522.8594. Be sure to call and make a reservation in advance.

A parking garage is attached to the hotel. The height clearance is 7 feet at the garage entrance, but once inside the garage, the height can be up to 9 feet on the ground floor only. Contact Becca if your vehicle will not fit in the garage. Parking is an added expense, please mark if needed on your registration form.
