AID services include job training and employment, autism services, housing supports, counseling, health care services, psychiatric and crisis intervention services, and family and community supports.

Operating in the greater Fox Valley area and other western suburban counties, AID is a leading provider of services that address the unique needs of individuals throughout every stage of their lives.

In FY 2023, AID served 5,200 children and adults.

AID currently operates 8 community day centers in Elgin, Aurora, Batavia and Yorkville, 15 mental health outpatient clinics throughout the Fox Valley, supports over 1,000 individuals living in their own apartments, and more than 200 individuals in 4 dozen group homes scattered throughout the greater Fox Valley.

WHAT IS OUTPATIENT

CHILDREN & FAMILY SERVICES?

Behavioral Health (BH) Outpatient Children and Family program offers a set of services which are intended to help reduce problems and improve coping skills within the least restrictive, clinically appropriate setting.

The primary purposes of Behavioral Health Outpatient Children's Services are to: provide counseling, to reduce symptoms of mental illness, and to improve coping skills thus allowing the child or adolescent to improve functioning at home, in school, and within the community.

HOW DO I GET STARTED?

All BH Outpatient services can be accessed through a variety of means, including: walk-in during regular business hours, referral from crisis services (including the crisis line after hours), and telephone referral. Intake services are generally offered on-site but changes can be made for off-site, if necessary. Frequencies of services are based on client need.

Payment sources include most Medicaid Integrated Care Programs, Medicare/Medicaid Alignment Initiative Programs, Medicare, self-pay, and private insurance. Appropriate referrals are accepted from any source, such as: self-referral, local area hospitals, Department of Children and Family Services, primary care physicians, probation officers, police departments, homeless shelters and many others.

WHAT DO WE OFFER?

We offer treatment to promote emotional, cognitive, behavioral and/or psychological changes using psychotherapy theory and techniques. In short, counseling and therapy services for children and adolescents.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- √ Seventeen (17) years of age or younger
- ✓ Diagnosed with a mental illness
- ✓ Intellectual capacity and insight to benefit from services
- √ Ability to function at a level that does not interfere with others ability to benefit from services

If clients are ineligible for services, they and their parents or guardians are informed of the reasons at intake or as soon as the issues are known

Based on client choice and privacy laws, family, support systems or referral sources are also informed.



WHAT CAN I EXPECT?

Counselors gather information from the client, family, and a range of collaterals to assess the need for services. A treatment plan is made with the client and family. BH Outpatient provides ongoing monitoring and follow-up for the client.

After evaluating the client's needs and making an individual growth-oriented service plan, the client and/or family may be linked to agencies in the community and treatment will begin. Clients are able to stop services at any time.
