Organized in 1961 by parents of 8 children with special needs, AID has grown to serve more than 4,500 children and adults with disabilities annually throughout the greater Fox Valley area. AID services include job training and employment, autism services, housing supports, counseling, health care services, psychiatric and crisis intervention services, and family and community supports.

Operating in the greater Fox Valley area and other western suburban counties, AID is a leading provider of services that address the unique needs of individuals throughout every stage of their lives.

AID currently operates 9 community day centers in Elgin, Aurora, Batavia, Sugar Grove and Yorkville, 15 mental health outpatient clinics throughout the Fox Valley, supports over 500 individuals living in their own apartments, and more than 200 individuals in 4 dozen homes scattered throughout the greater Fox Valley. AID also administers the Ride in Kane paratransit program in partnership with RTA, Pace, Kane County, and local municipalities and social service agencies.

DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES (DD)

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH (BH)

Children In-Home Support: Provides services to children with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) through the Medicaid Waiver program. The program provides families with a monthly allotment they can use to purchase needed services and supports that allow a child to continue to live in the family residence.

Client & Family Support: Provides case management, assessment and advocacy supports to individuals who are seeking admission to the organization while also offering referral and linkage services where needed.

Community Day Services: Assists individuals with I/DD maintain and/or enhance independent community living by focusing on community integration, volunteer opportunities, skill training and community employment.

Community Employment: Employment Specialists encourage AID clients to explore what they want from life, whether that involves employment, volunteering or a combination of both. Guided by the belief that everyone should have the opportunity to join the workforce, specialists offer employment readiness training, on-the-job support and coaching as necessary.

Community Employment also includes Individual Placement & Support (IPS). IPS helps people with mental health challenges find and keep jobs, while also providing employers access to motivated employees.

Community Living: Includes 24-hour and intermittent home setting services for individuals with developmental challenges to develop independent living skills.

Home Based Support: Helps individuals with I/DD continue to live safely and successfully in their own home by promoting growth, independence and self-direction.

AID Crisis Line of Fox Valley (630.966.9393):

Assists individuals with a wide variety of needs and concerns including depression, anxiety, loneliness and substance use. Callers are linked to appropriate referrals in their community. The Crisis Line also provides sunshine calls for seniors and persons with disabilities and linkage to community services.

Alcohol & Other Drugs Case Management:

Specialized treatment provided for people with both mental health and substance use issues.

Adult & Children's Outpatient Program:

Provides support and recovery for individuals experiencing a trauma, disruptive behavior disorders, family relationship problems, school issues for children or other mental health concerns. Visit AIDcares.org for a complete list of outpatient services.

Community Support Team (CST): CST is an intensive team approach that provides services to best meet client's mental health needs, reduce symptoms, reduce emergency room visits, prevent homelessness and eliminate unnecessary call-outs to emergency personnel. CST maintains 24/7 availability and offers intensive community support with a focus on meeting individual treatment goals.

Psychiatric & Psychosocial Rehabilitation Services:

Designed to help individuals overcome mental health issues, improve coping skills and facilitate a medication regime. Psychosocial Rehabilitation (PSR) offers group counseling interventions to assist individuals in developing new and refining current life skills needed to live successfully.

Residential Services: Includes the AID BH Supportive program, which offers Supportive Housing and Mental Health Case Management services to individuals in their own homes and apartments throughout Kane, Kendall, DeKalb and McHenry Counties. This program helps individuals with mental health concerns to maintain their homes in the community while receiving support and assistance with medications, health appointments, public benefits, accessing community resources, and counseling. Residential Services also include the BH Supervised program which has 24-hour mental health services available on site.

Victim & Outreach Services: Provides advocacy, case management and referral to those who are a victim of crime and/or trauma.
