



Federal Grant Program funded through HRSA One in every state, some territories, some targeted for Native Americans and Alaskan Natives


State-affiliated organization for Family Voices

In Illinois, F2F is a program of the Arc of IL










Who are These Children?

Physical disabilities	Cerebral palsy, epilepsy, or other neurological conditions
Developmental or intellectual disabilities	Chronic conditions like asthma, diabetes, or sickle cell anemia
Behavioral, emotional, mental health, or sensory issues	
	Learning disabilities
Autism spectrum disorders	
	Cancer or other blood disorders
Medical technology like a feeding tube or tracheostomy	
Genetic, chromosomal, or congenital conditions	Other health conditions or disabilities that affect a child's development or function
Vision or hearing impairments, or who are deaf or blind








Why is Family-to-Family Needed?














Professionals tend to siloed

Services tend to be siloed





What We Do: Help Families Navigate the Healthcare System Information to sign up for and understand insurance and Medicaid benefits

Find services for specific conditions such as autism or diabetes

Assist with finding services for behavioral health

Figure out what insurance/Medicaid covers and find ways to meet needs that aren't covered

Help families find healthcare services

Figure out how to respond to changes in state and federal policies














Find peer support and emotional support

Learn about Medicaid waivers, who is eligible, and how to apply

Assist with special education questions, including Section 504 plans and IEPs

What We Do: Help Families Navigate Disability Systems

Learn about PUNS waiting list and how to get on it


Help families build their own leadership and advocacy skills Assist with questions about other benefits like SSI, Title V (DSCC), SNAP, WIC



Help find respite care

Assist with coordinating care providers





Common Questions



- How can I get an autism diagnostic screening for my child?
- Can you help me find a therapist (especially ABA)?
- How do I get diapers covered by Medicaid?
- What Medicaid Waiver(s) is my child eligible for?
- What is PUNS and how long is the waiting list?
- What resources are there for families who don't qualify for any waivers?
- What help can I get while I am on a waiting list?
- Can you help me appeal my cut in home nursing hours?
- What is SSI and how do I get it?
- Can I get paid to take care of my child with a disability?
- Can you help me get better school services for my child?



What We Do: Advocacy and Training

Advocate for programs to improve the lives of children with disabilities and chronic medical conditions

Increase awareness about disabilities

Work with professionals, legislators, and lawyers

Keep up-to-date on state and federal policies that affect children with disabilities


Partner with Title V (DSCC) and other agencies

Outreach events at schools, for organizations, etc.

Webinars and conferences for families and professionals







What We Do: Helping Professionals



Provide information on topics outside their area of expertise

Assist with specific cases that require targeted help

Take referrals for cases from professionals


Provide new or recently updated/changed policy information

Provide trainings and webinars

Collaborate on advocacy or other projects

Professionals also teach us about their areas of expertise!





When Should Professionals Call Us or Refer to Us?



Whenever you need information beyond your own expertise



Whenever you are not permitted to provide the type of help necessary



When the case is too complicated or large in scope



When a case does not require your specific expertise




When a family mostly needs a listening ear










Other Arc of IL Programs

Family Support Network


Help for those with ID/DD to live and thrive in their own homes




