



- Truly individualized
- No "one correct path"
- THE CLIFF (so let's avoid it)
- Professional and personal perspective

FAMILY-TO-FAMILY GUIDANCE

"Get educated early"

"Go to parent trainings provided by a variety of agencies"

"Start early asking for transition plans and services! Document everything."

"Be realistic with the post transition goals. It is a process of adjustment and it takes some trial and error to get it right."

"Get on the PUNS list ASAP."

"You have to ask a lot of questions and do a lot of research on your own"

"Use whatever social and community connections you have to develop meaningful activities."

 - Community Living Facility
- ICF-DD Intermediate Care Facility for individuals with Developmental Disabilities
- MCDD Medically Complex for Developmentally Disabled
- SODC State Operated Developmental Center

To-Do List

- Get an Illinois State ID!
- Selective Service: all male US citizens and male immigrants age 18-25 are required to register
- PUNS? DRS Home Services?
- Apply for SSI once 18yo
- Apply for Medicaid once 18yo
- Legal support options
 - Supported Decision-Making?
 - Guardianship? What level of guardianship?
 - Power of Attorney?
- Gather and save paperwork
 - IEPs & Summary of Performance





State ID: do this before applying for Medicaid

- Driver's License/State ID Card (ilsos.gov)
- Free State ID cards valid for 10 years are available for persons with disabilities. To obtain a state ID card, please visit a <u>Secretary of State</u> <u>facility</u>. The applicant must provide an <u>Application for an Illinois</u> <u>Person with a Disability Identification Card</u> completed by his/her doctor.
- Acceptable identification documents: <u>Applying for an Illinois Driver's</u> <u>License or ID Card (ilsos.gov)</u>

How to apply

DDD

- Call your Independent Service Coordination office
 - IDHS: Office Locator (state.il.us)
 - Choose "Developmental Disability Services" from dropdown
- Ask to apply for PUNS list for Adults with DD Medicaid Waiver

DRS

- Contact local Division of Rehabilitation Services office
 - IDHS: Office Locator (state.il.us)
 - Choose "Rehabilitation Services" from dropdown
 - Or use Rehabilitation Services Web Referral DHS: Rehabilitation Services: Apply Online (illinois.gov)





SSI: Supplemental Security Income

- SSI makes monthly payments to people who have low income and few resources, and who meet one of the following criteria:
 - They are age 65 or older.
 - Blind.
 - They have a medical condition that keeps them from working, which is expected to last one year or result in death
- Income/Resource limits
- Medical eligibility
- Understanding SSI If You Are Disabled or Blind (ssa.gov)

Medicaid

- Healthcare coverage for low-income individuals
- Why apply if our child is on our private insurance?
 - Medicaid is payor of last resort always
 - Once pulled from PUNS, the Adults with Developmental Disabilities waiver is paid for by Medicaid

Guardianship

- At age 18, an individual becomes an adult and is legally able to make all their own decisions. In other words, parents can no longer make any decisions (medical, educational, employment, financial, personal, etc) for their child.
- Will your young adult need help when making these decisions?
- Options:
 - Do nothing (not recommended, but Health Care Surrogate Act comes into play)
 - Power of Attorney (least restrictive, multiple would be needed)
 - Supported Decision-Making
 - Guardianship (Limited, Person or Estate, or Plenary)

Gather and save paperwork

- IEPs, especially the most recent
- Summary of Performance (SOP): the document that is provided by the school when your young adult exits school services
- Educational Evaluations
- Psychological Evaluations (especially IQ test if possible)
- Diagnostics
 - Anything that proves the disability, especially that proves diagnosis prior to age 22

Centers for Independent Living (CILs)

- "...provide community-based, non-residential support for people with disabilities so they may achieve independence in every aspect of their lives, including home, work and school."
 - Home INCIL "Creating Barrier-Free Lives for People with Disabilities"
 - Find a CIL INCIL
 - CILs are run by and for the people they serve, with at least 51% of each CIL's staff and Board of Directors comprised of individuals with disabilities.
- Independent Living Movement
 - "People with disabilities are entitled to civil rights, options, and control over choices in their own lives"
 - Independent Living History Access Living

How does Illinois compare to other states?

Illinois Services for People with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities by the Numbers 2023

7 = Number of Illinois state institutions

= Number of states with no state institutions

1,645 = Number of people living in Illinois state institutions

= Number of states with fewer than 200 people living in state institutions (1)

= Number of states with fewer people living in state institutions than Illinois (1)

\$347,375/Yr. = FY22 Interim average annual Medicaid claiming rate for all Illinois state institutions (2)

\$405,150/Yr. = FY22 Interim average annual Medicaid claiming rate for most expensive Illinois IDD state institution (2)

\$90,728/Yr. = 2022 average topline CILA reimbursement for people receiving 24-hour care (3)
