

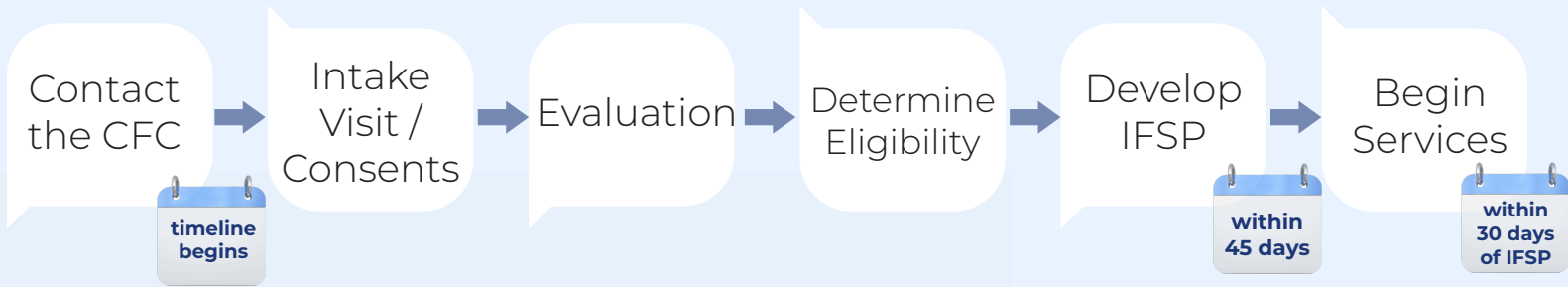
ILLINOIS EARLY INTERVENTION

REFERRAL PROCESS



ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible, a child:

- 1 Must be under 36 months, and
- 2 Have a physician's diagnosis of a physical or mental condition that causes a developmental delay, or
- Have an identifiable developmental delay of 30% or more, or
- Be at risk of substantial developmental delay because of certain risk factors.

AUTO - ELIGIBILITY

- 1 Children with an elevated blood lead level greater or equal to 3.5 micrograms per deciliter
- 2 Any child under the age of 3 who is the subject of a substantiated case of child abuse or neglect, as defined in the federal Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act
